Summary: Patient got road traffic accident on 11-06-2025 and was admitted in the hospital and discharged on 15-06-2025 (5 days) due to motor vehicle collision, according to the medical reports issued, the patient suffered from fracture of transverse process of lumbar vertebra, hematuria, left flank pain, pneumocephalus, trauma to head and abdomen, laceration on the parietal area about 3 cm, blood in the urine, non displaced fracture of left transverse process of L2 vertebra Grade I retrolithesis of L5 over S1, non displaced fracture of dorsum sella associated with minute pneumocephalus seen at posterior bilateral parietal subgaleal hematoma.

Overall impression now and future needs:

Patient was reviewed today in my clinic, and his injury condition has stabilized and has become final in nature and character, as a result of the traffic accident that the patient experienced on the aforementioned date and we state the following:

1. He still has pain with difficulty doing his routine daily activity.
2. Patient has required physical therapy for minimum 6 months.
3. Avoid weight bearing, aggressive movements, lifting heavy objects and or to do sportive activity
4. He advised to take oral pain killers for his pain if needed.
5. According to the current situation, I can estimate the disability due to his traumatic head injury as 15 % of his mental power, there is decrease in the mental activity regarding memory, attention, and perception, and 25% from the power of his back.
6. Patient is unable to go back to his work as driver.
